

MEET OUR FOUNDER



TONYA DIONE JONES

CEO / Founder United Together Lupus Foundation Tonya was born in Saginaw; she is the daughter of Thomas Askew, Sr. and Daisy and Benjamin Furlough. She is the devoted wife to James Jones, Sr. for 29 years and counting. They have four boys and three daughters, twelve grandchildren and one great-grandson.

Tonya Jones was raised by her mother and grandparents. It was her grandmother Eddie Mae Weston who instilled in her the importance of having a relationship with God and accepting His Son Jesus Christ as Lord. In 1998 Mrs. Jones became a member of Greater All Nation Prayer Tower COGIC, in Saginaw, MI under the leadership of Superintendent Louis Bishop for twenty years, until his retirement. While under his leadership Tonya received her Deaconess License in 2000, and her Evangelist License in 2001 under the Jurisdictional Southwest #1 COGIC MAAI Institution.

In June 2015 Tonya became a member of Dominion Life Ministries in Bay City, MI under the leadership of Pastor Mestisha Castleberry. In 2019 Minster Jones received her Minister's License under the leadership of Pastor Mestisha Castleberry. Tonya has a servant's heart and faithfully serves where there is a need.

FROM A SISTER'S PRESPECTIVE

From 2009-2016 Tonya began to have one health issue after another, then finally, in the summer of 2016, she was given the devastating diagnosis. You have lupus. As I watch my sister go head to toe with lupus, my thoughts are W.O.W., what a "Woman of Warfare". Mrs. Jones refused to lose this battle with lupus. She took the Word of God and planted her faith in the Word of God. She began to go even more boldly and confidently into God's presence, than she ever had before. She was determined to find help from God her Father during this time in her life when she needed him the most. (Hebrews 4:16) I watched lupus turn her legs into soft mass with no bone, unable to walk with her own two feet. I watched as lupus attacked her eyes impairing her ability to see, but thank God Tonya relies on the light that comes from the Word of God. (Psalm 119:105)

I watched lupus snatch the hair from her head, Satan's goal, to destroy her self-esteem. I watched lupus attack her heart and her kidneys. In all that Tonya went through, she refused to believe the report of the enemy; instead, Tonya made a conscious decision to protect her heart with the Word of God. Mrs. Jones knew to guard her heart above all else, because it determines the course of her life. (Proverbs 4:23 NLT) She refused to give up no matter what her body went through. She relied on her spirit man to be renewed day by day, because she knew that was where her true strength lies. (2 Corinthians 4:15-17)

TONYA SPEAKS ON HER JOURNEY

In 2009 my health started to decline at the young age of 40. On December 31, 2012, I had to close my day care due to my declining health. Twenty-five years in business snatched away from me because of the pulverizing affect lupus had on my body, I was devastated. Soon after I closed my daycare; my health took a serious nosedive. I was in and out of the hospital week, after week.

Finally in 2013 I was sent to a neurologist, my God-ordained help. As he looked at my chart, I could see the concern on his face. This neurologist sent by God, under the unction of the Holy Spirit went against protocol and told me, "If you value your life, you will find a new doctor. He wrote down the names of three doctors. I moved quickly.

By June of 2013 I had a new doctor. I saw specialist after specialist to no avail. I was taking 22 pills daily. I was unable to live the life I once lived and was greatly depressed because of it. This debilitating disease had made me a prisoner in my own home. The stress of it all caused me to fall into a deep depression; and to make matters worse, the 150,000 we had set aside from my husband's disability settlement was now all gone. The mental stress of it all. If only I had never gotten sick. Now how are we going to take care of our family of five. It was too much to bear, I had a nervous breakdown, that left me unable to walk or talk.

Looking at myself in this situation put a fight in me unlike I had never known. My faith in God gave me the strength to take the control Satan thought he had over my life back. I told myself, this is not who God created you to be. I began attending church and family functions again. I pressed my way, often in tears because the pain was so excruciating, but nevertheless, I pressed on.

In 2015 my primary doctor, recognizing that I was showing symptoms and signs of lupus sent me to a Nephrologist and a Rheumatologist specialist. After not knowing all these years it was finally confirmed that I had lupus. I was devastated. Yet at the same time, thankful to God that I now had a name, that I could tell to bow down and surrender its authority to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

MEET OUR FOUNDER

Finally, my life seemed to be getting back on track. In the summer of 2016, I began having unbearable pain all over my entire body. I eventually went to the hospital and was diagnosed with Stage 5 Lupus Nephritis. Satan was coming after me with a vengeance. The organ he assigned to kill me was my very own kidneys. The report finally came back, kidney failure. The last words the doctor spoke was, "It's in God's hands now!" My children were around my bed crying. There I lay refusing to believe the report of the enemy. I told my children; "Momma will be alright. I am going to beat this!" God has not failed me yet. "I will not die; instead, I will live to tell what the LORD has done." (Psalm 118:17 NLT)

Shortly after that I was sent to the University of Michigan. The team of doctors there helped me get lupus under control. I went from taking twenty-two pills daily to six pills a day. Lupus is still a daily battle, but the worst is behind me. God has without a doubt shined His face upon me over the years, and I am so grateful that he did!

In February 2022 the Lord spoke to me with a soft voice, "It's time!" "Time for what", I asked. "Time to look for a building" my Father God, replied. I followed my Father's instructions, with nothing but faith to pay the rent. Finally three months later, in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. I opened the doors to United Together Lupus Foundation. How wonderfully orchestrated by God, that I would open the doors to my foundation in the month that brings awareness to lupus.

I have found purpose in the midst of my fight with lupus. My purpose has become crystal clear: to be a voice to the voiceless, and to give hope to the hopeless by being an advocate for those just like myself, battling lupus.

My sister has manifested this verse in her life, and it bears repeating, "Tonya will not die; instead, she will live to tell what the LORD has done", and that is exactly what she is doing.



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
